## Woman, Pleading Not Guilty, Bound Over On Three Charges Of Forgery

A Lakeview woman who was placed on probation last month by the Middle District federal court for theft from mailboxes at the Lakeview post office was bound over for grand jury action on three counts of check forgery Monday in Moore County Recorder's Court at Carthage.

The hearing had been begun but had been continued, in the court last month, when Judge J. Vance Rowe decided, from the evidence given at that time, that further investigation was required and more witnesses should be subpoenaed. Instructing the sheriff to this effect, he scheduled the hearing to be resumed this week, when County Solicitor W. Lamont Brown would have returned from a European tour.

The charges involved three checks, two for \$25 and one for \$20, forged in the name of N. M. McKeithan, Aberdeen resident with extensive farming interests near Vass. Made payable to, and showing purported endorsements of, two brothers of Mrs. Wallace, they had been cashed at various places in Moore County. Mrs. Wallace, testifying in her own behalf when the hearing was first called, denied any knowledge of the checks, but stated her belief that at least one had been forged by her son.

Mrs. Hazel Cummings Wallace, pleading not guilty in the preliminary hearing, made bond of \$300 set for all three cases.

The hearing had been begun but had been continued, in the court last month, when Judge J. Vance Rowe decided, from the evidence given at that time, that further investigation was required and more witnesses should be subpoenaed. Instructing the sheriff to this effect, he scheduled the hearing to be resumed this week, when County Solicitor W. Lamont Brown would have returned from a European tour.

Mrs. Wallace, testifying in her own behalf when the hearing was first called, denied any knowledge of the checks, but stated her belief that at least one had been forged by her son.

L. B. Horne, her teen-aged son by a previous marriage, was brought in Monday as a defendant, also charged with forgery, but in view of his denials, and without any sustaining evidence, the case against him did not stand up and he was released.

Additional witnesses subpoenaed were Mrs. Wallace's brothers "Dink" and "Buddy" Cummings, who also denied any knowledge of the forgeries, or having cashed or profited from them in any way.

Before the son's acquittal, handwriting samples of both mother and son were taken in court and compared with the checks, both apparently showing some similarities with the checks and with each other, though nothing conclusive. Solicitor Erown expressed his view that the female defendant was disguising her handwriting, and the case took an unexpected turn when Roy Horne, her ex-husband, then appeared in court, handing the Solicitor a note which he said was in his former wife's "natural" hand. It had been written by her to her son while she was held in jail.

Comparison of this note with the checks resulted in the finding of probable cause against Mrs. Wallace. Whether any further handwriting analysis was planned was not stated, and Judge Rowe ordered the entire case file locked up until the trial, as it contained practically all the evidence in the case.

#### Assault Charges

Assaults of various types featured Monday's docket, also the usual traffic offenses, including one which appeared to sum up a good many of them all by itself. This was the case of Lee Roger Flowers, 17-year-old Negro youth of Jackson Springs Route 1, who pleaded guilty to the following charges brought by Trooper R. R. Samuels after an accident in Mineral Springs township September 21: careless and reckless driving, accident, personal injury, leaving scene without giving name, no liability insurance, no registration, no license plate. Flowers was handed a six months' road sentence, suspended for 12 months on payment of a \$100 fine and costs, and directed not to drive a motor vehicle on the public highways during the suspension period, also to pay or cause to be paid the damage done to the other car.

#### Other Cases

Other cases disposed of: Gilford G. Patterson, Cameron, driving while drunk, 60 days or \$100 and costs, license revoked for 12 months; Tommy Sparrow Davis, Seagrove, Route 2, careless and reckless driving, accident, personal injury, 60 days suspended for 12 months on payment of \$35 and costs, not to drive in careless and reckless manner or at excessive speed during suspension period; Coy Stephen Lewis III, Robbins, exceeding safe speed, accident, \$10 and costs; Minor Eugene Freeman, Robbins, Route 2, driving without insurance, no license plates, 60 days or \$25 and costs, not to operate car until he first complies with laws; Raymond Elliott McMillan, Addor, driving without license, improper brakes, \$15 and costs, not to operate car till he secures license and has brakes repaired; James Banner Ewing, Pinehurst, driving while drunk, no operator's license, 60 days or \$100 and costs, license revoked 12 months; Roy Brower, Jackson Springs, driving without license, bad muffler, resisting arrest, six months suspended for two years on payment of \$100

and costs, not to operate motor vehicle on public highways during next 12 months, no law violations; Howard Booth Rutledge, N. C. State, Raleigh, careless and reckless driving, unlawful possession of seal-broken whiskey, \$25 and costs.

Lonnie Jesse Farlow, Robbins, Route 2, careless and reckless driving, judgment continued on payment of \$25 and costs, defendant to obey traffic laws; Linda Rebecca Arrington, Southern Pines, driving without license, \$25 and costs; Mattie Cox, Sanford, Route 5, driving while drunk, judgment continued on payment of \$100 and costs, license revoked 12 months; Jimmie Gant Horne, Rockingham, escaping from prison, in view of sentence recently imposed in Richmond county for offenses connected with this escape, this court imposes sentence of only 60 days; Mike Daugherty, Carthage, and William McPhail, Raeford, assault and battery on female, malicious damage, not guilty; Howard Carson Campbell, Cameron, Route 1, driving while drunk, after license suspension, not guilty; Johnny Richard Livingston, Pope AFB, speeding 70 in 55-mile zone, 30 days or \$25 and costs, not guilty of careless and reckless driving.

Cecil Earl Williams, Eagle Springs, Route 1, and W. C. Morgan, Star, Route 1, malicious destruction of property, Williams also charged with assault and battery, and assault on a female, judgment continued in both cases until next Monday when defendants are to be tried on larceny charges, Williams to be held until then under \$750 cash bond, Morgan's bond of \$1,000 already made to be continued until Monday; Henry McLeod, assault on female, the prosecuting witness Kate McLeod failing to appear when the case was called, subpoena ordered to issue for her for show cause hearing next Monday; Alton McCrimmon, assault and battery on son, judgment continued on payment of costs and good behavior toward all his family during next two years; James Martin, assault with deadly weapon (glass), prosecuting witness failing to appear, subpoena ordered to issue requiring him to appear in court next Monday to testify in this case; Eugene Martin, assault with deadly weapon, called and failed, capias to issue returnable next Monday, a good justified or cash bond of \$250 required for his appearance; Irving Peele, assault with deadly weapon, not pros with leave (defendant in state hospital); Charles E. Blackwell, violation of judgment, capias dismissed (defendant having already served the 30 days' sentence in this case); Otis Brower, assault on a female, costs; Rufus Hampton, Eagle Springs, Route 1, assault with deadly weapon (pistol) with intent to kill, continued because of illness of defendant.
