The investigating trooper, R. R. Samuels, listed as seriously injured, Shirley Ingram, sister of the dead woman and driver of the car, and James Gaines, both of Jackson Hamlet; and Connie Ruth Stubbs, of Southern Pines.

He stated the cause to be a blown right front tire. The car was running off the road on the shoulder for 198 feet before it wrecked, he said.

The accident took place on a straight stretch of road, the car leaving the highway and crashing into a clump of small pine trees while headed toward Pinehurst.
