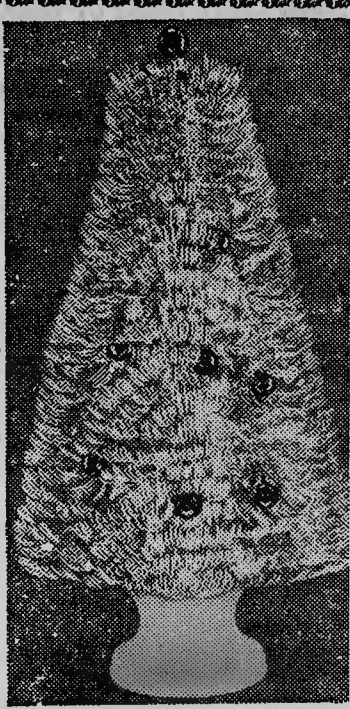
TURKEY SHOOT

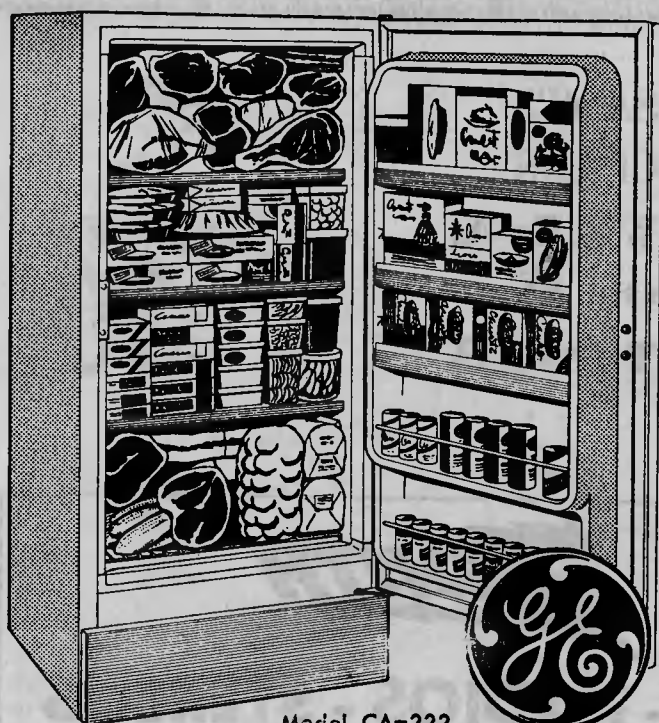
