Thom McKenzie, 43, Dies; Services Conducted Today

Thomas W. (Thom) McKenzie, 43, of Pinehurst was found dead Tuesday morning in a house trailer he had been recently occupying, off US Highway 1 north of Southern Pines.
A native of the Juniper Lake section near Pinehurst, he served with the Navy during World War 2, mostly in the Pacific Theater. He served twice as commander of the John Boyd Post, VFW, and was also a member of the Sandhill Post, American Legion, the Forty and Eight, and the Southern Pines Elks Club. A refrigeration engineer, he had owned and operated his own refrigeration and heating service and had worked widely in this area in those fields.
Funeral services were held this (Thursday) morning at Judae Presbyterian Church, conducted by the pastor, the Rev. W. K. Fitch, Jr., with burial in the church cemetery. Legions of the Sandhill Post will serve as pallbearers.
Surviving are his wife, the former Mary Sullivan, of Pinehurst; one son, Jerry, of Boone; three daughters, Michael, Nineald, of Spennargle, N.C., and Peggy and Laurie, of the home; and two brothers, Wren McKenzie of Weaverville and James McKenzie, with the U.S. Air Force in New Jersey.

Christmas Holidays At Lee Center Announced

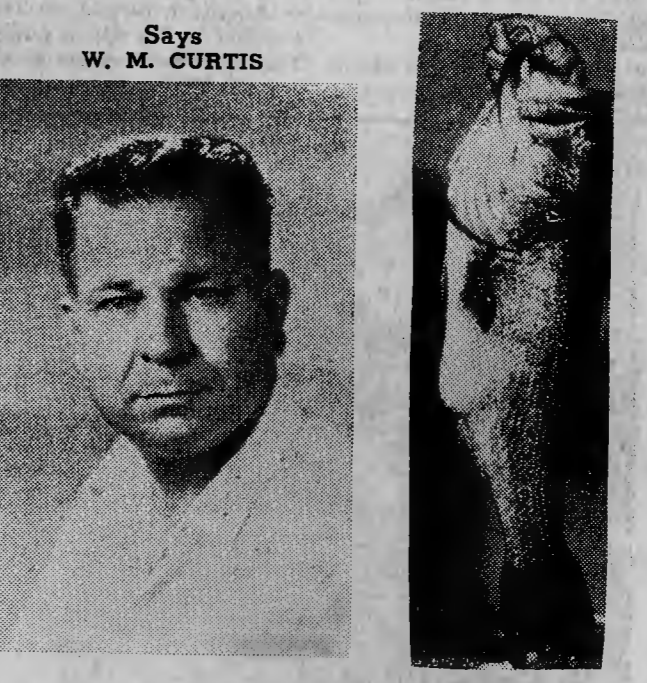
