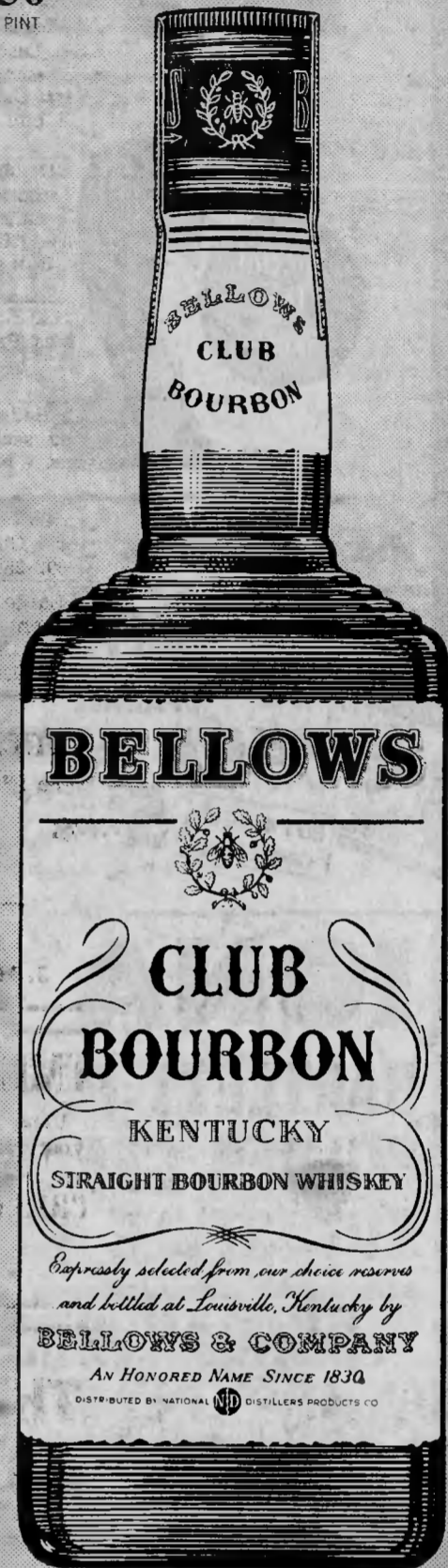
**H. D. Club Meets**
