Fine N&S Coverage

Photographer John Hemmer, who has been publicizing Pinehurst for over 40 years, was elated over the fine coverage given the two North & South tournaments—the women's held April 20-24, and the six-day men's amateur, which finished Saturday at the Pinehurst Country Club. John hauled seven newsmen around the Championship Number Two Course Saturday before Dale Morey's 3 and 2 lead over Billy Joe Patton closed out the final match of the championship on the 34th hole.

From equipment set up in one of the Pinehurst hotels, visiting newsmen sent out from four to five wire photos each day of the two weeks. In fact, Hemmer's son John, also a top photographer in New York City, told his father he was staggered to see the big layouts in the tournaments in the Metropolitan papers. With seven reporters here from state dailies, an AP reporter, and the Pinehurst Press Bureau feeding daily reports to the UP wire service, the coverage almost approximated that of the U. S. Amateur played here two years ago.

Tries To Tie Record

Patton, the smiling man from Morganton, who tried so hard to become the first man since George Dunlap, Jr. to win three N&S titles in a row, was as always, a good loser.

Incidentally, any golfer would have a hard time beating George's record—he won four straight titles, 1963-36.

In '34, George smashed a course record with a 63, and in the final

round, in which he played the late Donald Parson of Pinehurst, he set a record for tournament putting, taking only 15 putts in 17 holes and 17 putts in 18, holding two 20-foot chip shots from the edge of the then sand greens. He missed only one putt in the entire round—on the 18th hole, sinking his next one for a total of 17 putts.

George and his wife and their son and daughter moved from Pinehurst, where they lived many years (in fact, George cut his eye teeth on the Pinehurst courses), to Fort Lauderdale, Fla., where he became interested in boats. George and Kay now live in New Jersey, and he has long given up playing competitive golf.

Charles Stencil, bellhop at the Holly Inn for 12 years, who last week won the Charlotte Observer prize puzzle to the tune of \$450, is, we believe, only the second prize puzzle winner in Pinehurst.

Mrs. Bess Warrell, who was at that time nursing for the late James Pryor Williamson, was a winner several years ago, picking up over \$400. She lives in Pinehurst and is now the nurse for Walter D. Hyatt.
