**Records Fall As SPHS Track Team
 Places Second In Meet Held Here**

 The Southern Pines Blue Knights Track team placed second in a meet with Carolina Military Academy and Ellerbe at Memorial Field in Southern Pines. The Blue Knights earned 59 points to Carolina Military's 89 points and Ellerbe's 18 points.
 The Blue Knights took first place in the pole vault, high and low hurdles and mile run, and tied for first in the high jump. Carolina Military picked up nine first places and Ellerbe received none.
 Mac Fowler was the high man for Southern Pines collecting 13 points while breaking his own Southern Pines High School re-

cord in the Pole Vault (10 feet, 4 inches), clearing 10 feet, 9 inches. Dan Thomas broke the record for the hundred yard dash with a time of 10.5 seconds. The old one was 10.7 which he set last year.
 Sophomore Harry Webb broke the 120 yard high hurdle time by two seconds, posting a 17.8 time. Peter Pezzi equaled the 220 dash record of 25 seconds and leaped 19 feet, 11 1/2 inches in the broad jump to take second place.
 The Blue Knights will compete in the Moore County Track Meet on May 6 which is to be held in Southern Pines and will complete their season competing in the district meet.

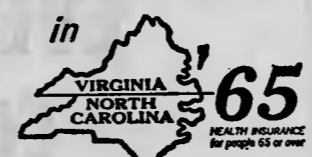
Track Events
