AT 'LOST CITY'

Woman Held For Murder In Death Of Husband, 28

22-year-old woman who fired a 12-gauge shotgun point-blank at her husband from a distance of about eight feet Sat-urday afternoon is in Moore County jail at Carthage, charged

with his murder.
Chief Deputy Sheriff H. H. Grimm, who investigated the slaying at "Lost City," small community on the outskirts of West Southern Pines, said that Reba Ann Williams told him she didn't mean to do it. But Grimm quoted witnesses as saying she loaded up the shotgun in a bedroom, came to the porch where her husband, Eli Williams, 28, was sitting in a chair, shoved aside her sister Beulah Daniels of Vass. who was standing in the doorway pointed the gun at Eli and fired.

Williams fell dead with a gaping hole in the front of his shoulder, close to his neck. The coroner was not called, Grimm said. "since there were witnesses and no doubt at all as to what had happened." 
