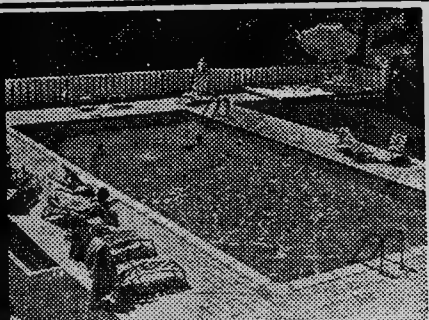

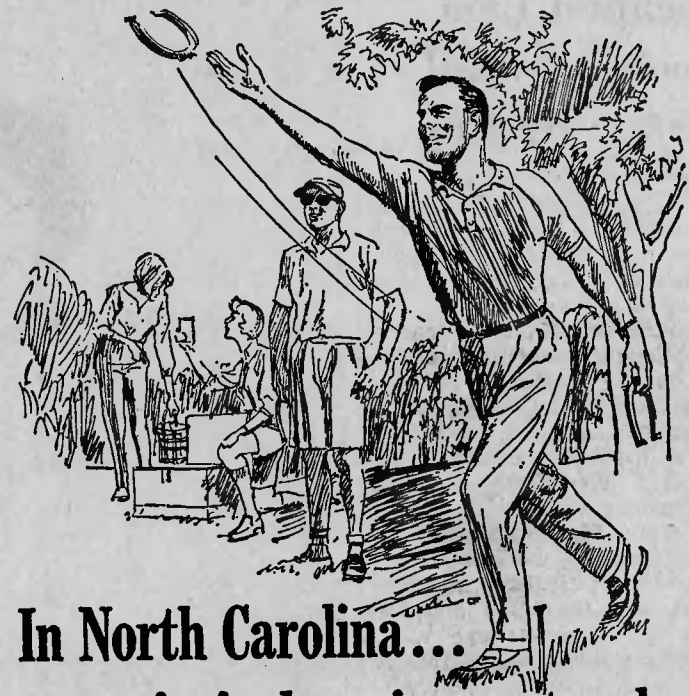
Legion Post At West End Places Wreath, 85 Flags

This is the third time that the Service Award has been won by the Pinehurst GE dealer.

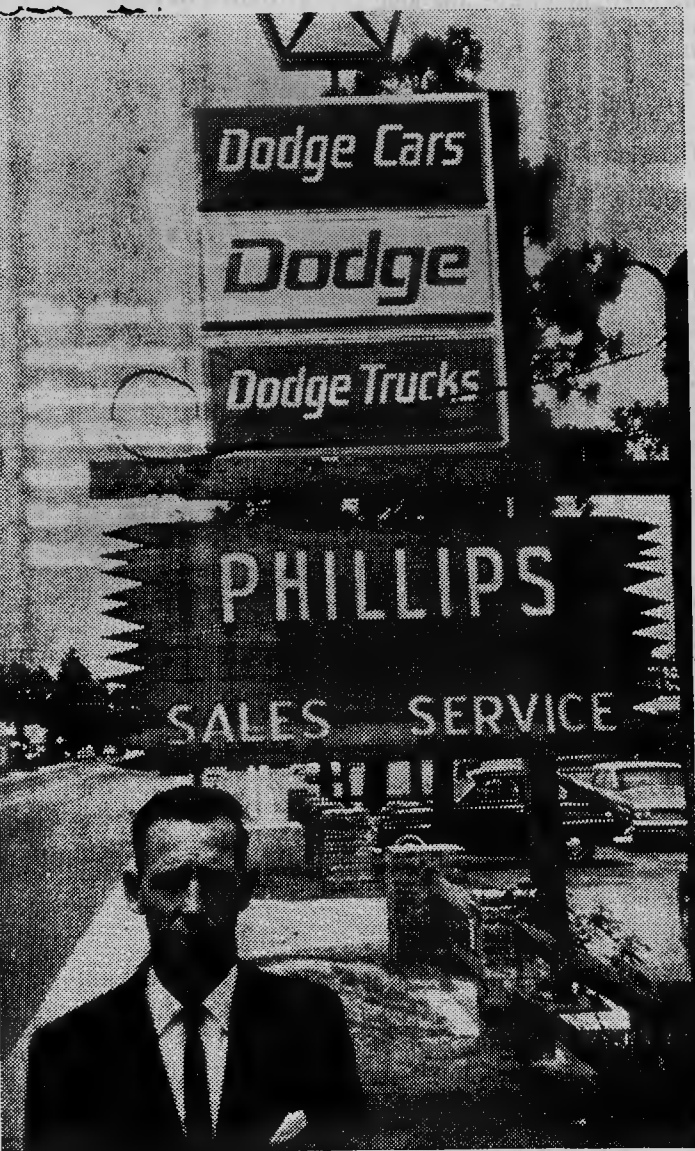
support of military operations. Sergeant McGalliard, a radio operator in the company, entered the Army in September, 1951, and was last stationed at Fort Bragg.

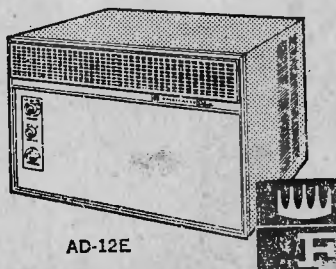

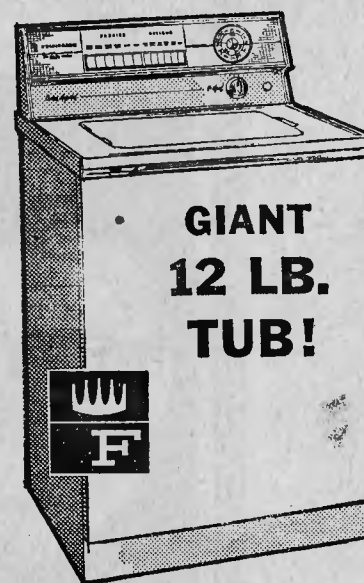

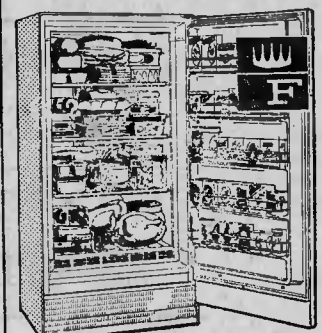
