Collegian Speaks

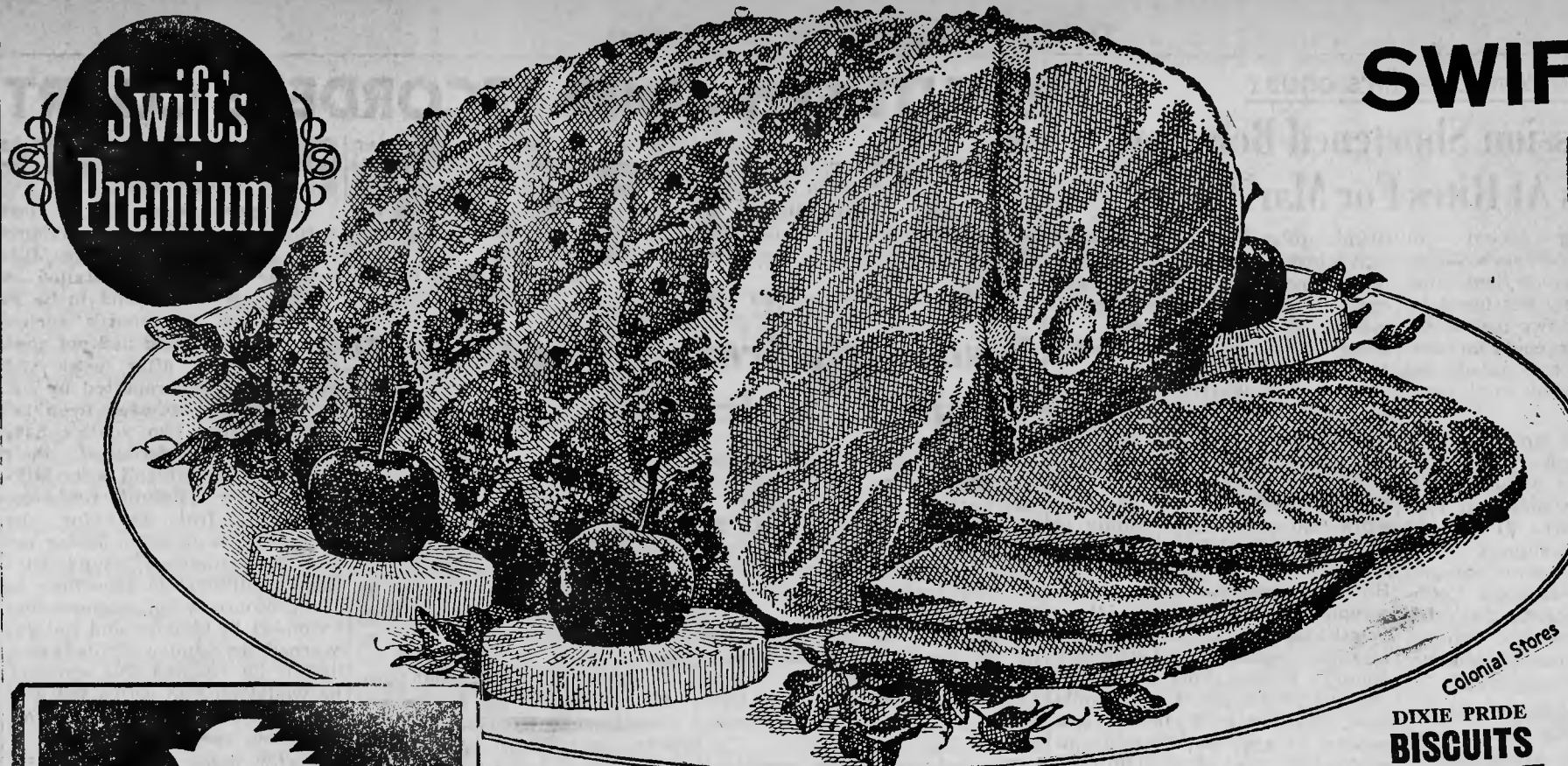
