**MOORE COUNTY RECORDER'S COURT**

**Drinking, Driving Offenses Aired In Short Session At Carthage Monday**

Drinking and driving—separately and together—seemed to cause most of the troubles aired in Moore County Recorders Court at Carthage, Monday. Here is a summary of all cases heard:

Rudolph Hardy, Pinehurst, unlawful possession of illicit whiskey, public drunkenness, \$35 including costs; Joe Furr, Vass, assault on wife, not pros with leave on payment of costs, on request of prosecuting witness; Samuel Gaston Taylor, Carthage, careless and reckless driving, accident, property damage, amended to charge public drunkenness, found guilty of public drunkenness, not guilty of careless and reckless driving, 30 days or \$10 and costs.

James Luis Stubbs, Southern Pines, careless and reckless driving, 60 days or \$25 and costs, defendant to pay or cause to be paid damage to car with which he collided; Donald Earl Kanter, Robbins, Route 1, public drunkenness, unlawful possession, found guilty first charge, not guilty second charge, 30 days suspended for 90 days on payment of \$10 and costs and strict sobriety conditions; Jackie Donaldson and Guy McNeill, West End, using vile and profane language at Fairgrounds in presence of two or more persons, prayer for judgment continued for each on payment of \$25 and costs as to Donaldson and \$35 and costs as to McNeill.

Lonnie W. Perry, Southern Pines, speeding 54 in 35-mile zone, \$15 and costs; Herbert T.

Williams, failure to comply, \$500 bond to be paid into clerk's office, and amount of bond to be paid to defendant's wife in accordance with judgment, capias to issue for defendant, returnable Monday to show cause why he should not be imprisoned; Harry Donald Simpler, Robbins, speeding 75 in 5-mile zone, \$25 and cost.

Richard Wilson Johnson, Jackson Springs, careless and reckless driving, accident, personal injury, found guilty exceeding safe speed, judgment continued on payment of \$15 and costs, defendant to pay or cause to be paid medical expenses of passenger hurt in accident; James Edward Marley, Carthage, careless and reckless driving, driving without license, \$35 and costs; Juanita Key Britt, Robbins, assault on dbattery (knife) and Bobby Britt, Robbins, attempted assault with deadly weapon, both found guilty, joint fine of \$25 and costs, covering both cases, sheriff ordered to destroy the knife.

**Noted Book To Be Reissued By Presbyterians**

Announcement has been made by Dr. Harold J. Dudley, general secretary of the Synod of North Carolina will be ready for distribution by approximately December 1.

The re-publishing of the famous chronicles are being made possible as a joint project of the Committee on Historical Matters of the Synod of North Carolina, Presbyterian Church in the United States, and the North Carolina Presbyterian Historical Society.

The "Sketches" first appeared in 1846 and were re-published by order of the Presbyterian Synod of North Carolina in 1912. Copies of the first edition are sought by rare book dealers and sell expensively.

The Rev. William Henry Foote, D. D., a Presbyterian clergyman, was born in Connecticut in 1794 and died in Romney, West Virginia in 1869.

**Driver Licenses Soon To Provide For Medical Data**

According to Commissioner Edward Scheidt of the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles all new and renewed driver's licenses issued in North Carolina, beginning in November, will provide a form for medical information which could be useful in the event of an emergency.

The special form, believed to be the first in the United States to be made a part of a driver's license, provides space for blood type (group and Rh factor), the date of your last tetanus shot (and whether it was toxoid or antitoxin), drugs or medicines a person may be taking or to which he is allergic and other medical data such as conditions of diabetes or epilepsy or the wearing of contact lens.

The new addition to the driver's license was suggested by the Committee on Trauma of the North Carolina Chapter of the American College of Surgeons as a part of a continuing statewide program to improve medical care for accident victims.



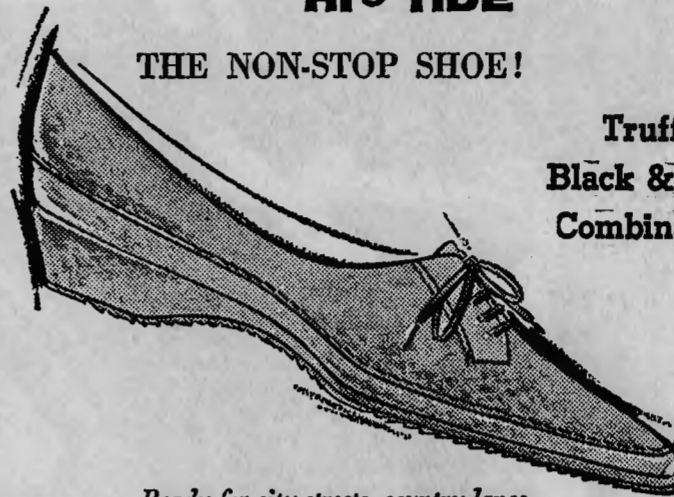
