UDC Chapter Meeting Held In Pinehurst

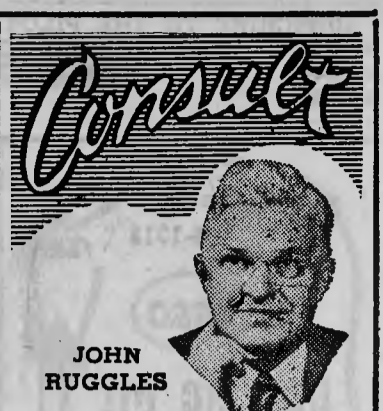
