Elected To Country Club, Tin Whistles

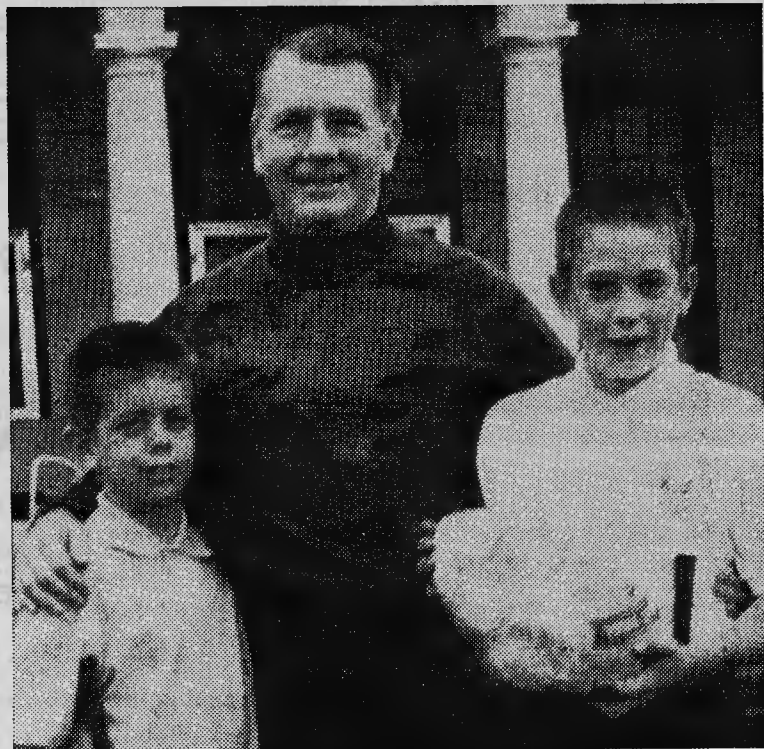

Marshall Memorial

Today, December 31, is the birthdate of the late General George C. Marshall. During his retirement years, when he and his wife were Pinehurst winter residents, the General celebrated his birthday quietly with a gathering of close friends, in contrast to the frequently hectic parties going on in most places on New Year's Eve.

But the General and his wife were among the most reserved and unobtrusive residents who ever came here.

Since General Marshall's death in 1959, a yearly memorial service for him has been held at Marshall Park, named in his honor shortly before he died.

This service, until last year, was held as close to December 31 as possible. However, because Mrs. Marshall, who always attends, does not come to the Sandhills until later in the winter, and because of the usual undependability of the weather at this time of year, the date was changed to

early spring. And this year, also, the service will be held in late April, according to a spokesman for the American Legion, which is in charge of the event.

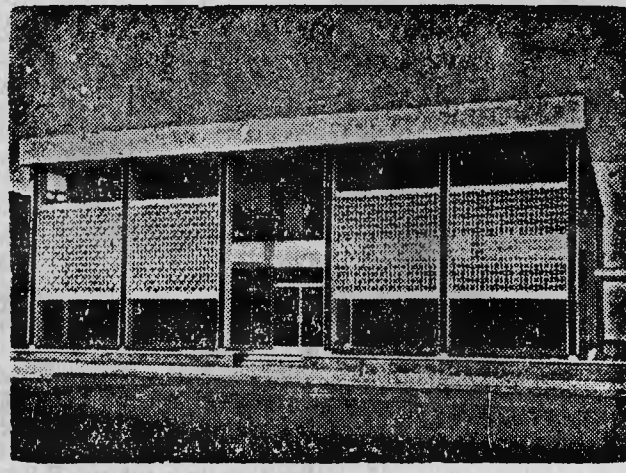
