**Firms Sponsor Reprinting Of News Story On Area's Progress In 1964**

A story about Moore County's growth and progress in 1964, which appeared in the Pilot of December 31, has been reprinted in a four-page brochure for distribution as advertising for the county and the Sandhills area.

Sponsoring the printing of 5,000 copies are the Southern Pines office of the Southern National Bank and Clarendon Gardens and Nursery, of Pinehurst.

The brochure will be distributed to hotels and motels of this area, where visitors can pick them up. It will be available at the Southern Pines Information Center or can be obtained at the local bank or at Clarendon Gardens. Distribution probably will also be made to other public places where it might draw the attention of visitors.

The reprinting project originated when Francis W. Howe, owner and operator of Clarendon Gardens, read The Pilot item and was so impressed he said, by the summary of 1964's growth and progress in industry, business, medical care, recreation and other fields of activity, that he

wished persons outside the area might have an opportunity to see it.

The new brochure, which was printed this week by The Pilot's job shop, is headed "One Year in Moore County, N. C.—A Review of Well Balanced Growth." The newspaper-type headline over the reprinted story reads, "Progress On March In Sandhills And Moore County, 1964."

Mr. Howe said he hopes that residents of this area getting copies of the brochure will send them out of the state to persons who might be interested in knowing more about Moore County and the Sandhills.

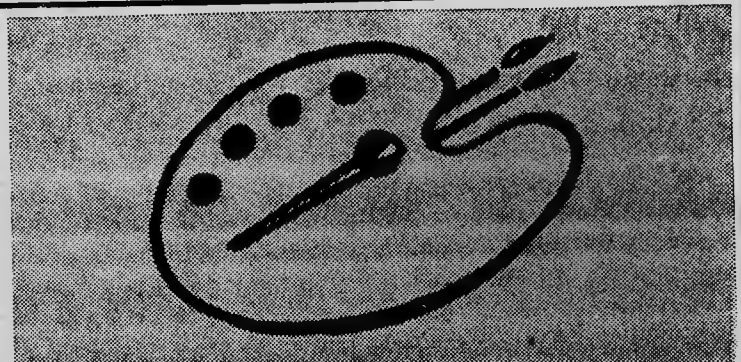
**IN WASHINGTON**  
**Jonas Assigned Appropriations Committee Posts**

Eighth District Congressman Charles Raper Jonas of Lincoln-ton, beginning his seventh term in the United States House of Representatives, has been assigned to new positions of importance on the powerful House Appropriations Committee. Moore County is in the 8th District.

Congressman Jonas recently was made ranking minority member of the eight-man Subcommittee on Independent Offices of the Appropriations Committee. Congressman Albert Thomas of Texas, with whom Congressman Jonas has worked closely in the past, is again chairman of the subcommittee.

Also recently, Congressman Frank T. Bow of Ohio, senior Republican on the Appropriations Committee, named Congressman Jonas chairman of a Task Force of expert budget-cutters. The job of the Task Force is "to call public attention to unnecessary spending it uncovers in the President's budget request for fiscal year 1966."

Congressman Jonas is now the second-ranking Republican on the committee. He has had the assignment to Appropriations for 10 of the 12 years he has served in Congress and is the only North Carolina member on the committee.
