Broader enlistment policies, designed to give young men a greater opportunity to join the U. S. Air Force, have been announced by T-Sgt. Richard D. Davis of the Air Force recruiting office at Rockingham.

Sergeant Davis visits the Southern Pines Post office each Thursday, from 10 am to noon.

Major feature of the change is that the Air Force will now accept otherwise qualified young men who have not completed high school. If accepted, they will be given an opportunity to complete their education through high school or beyond, if they so choose, the recruiter said.
