Southern Pines Recorders Court

For driving after his license was permanently revoked, a local man, Arthur Lucas of N. Ashe St., was sentenced to one year on the roads, with no privilege of suspended sentence, by Judge W. Harry Fullenwider in the regular Wednesday session of Southern Pines Recorder's Court last week.

Appeals were entered by other defendants to whom prison sentences were meted out. Wade H. Maness of Route 2, Carthage, charged with possession of and transporting non-tax-paid whiskey, appealed to Superior Court his sentence of one month on the roads, and bond was set at \$300. Two West Southern Pines men, James Ransome and Hubert Stanback, each charged with affray, each appealed a sentence of three months on the roads, and bond for each was set at \$400. In the case of Stanback, who has been in court here previously on numerous occasions, the judge directed that his court record be sent to Carthage, to be considered in Superior Court when his case is heard.

Appeal to Superior Court was also entered by Milton Everett McLean of Southern Pines who

was convicted of drunken driving, was fined \$100 and was taxed with the costs. Bond was set at \$300.

Other cases heard last week: Richard Worth Chavis, Route 3, Carthage, speeding 50 in 35 zone, pay costs and walk to Howard Johnson's Restaurant and back (at option of defendant in place of paying a fine); Harvey Lee Wall, Vass, unsafe movement resulting in accident, \$10 and costs; Patrick Joseph Graham, disobeying stop signal, \$5 and costs; Emmit Ray Cole, Addor, indecent exposure, pay the costs; Willie Benton Brown, Pinehurst, public drunkenness, \$5 and costs; Lula Campbell, abandonment of minor children, prayer for judgment continued, no costs.

Thomas Lewis Hall, Route 3, Carthage, affray, \$5 and costs; Bobby Hill, Aberdeen, common law public nuisance, prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs, defendant to stay off the premises of his father-in-law; James D. Cameron, Newark, N. J., speeding 50 in 35 zone, \$15 and costs, also no operator's license, Wayne Berkibile, West End, affray, one month on the roads, suspended for 12 months on payment of \$15 fine and costs and on condition he not be convicted of a similar offense for 12 months.

Major Cole Cited For Completion Of Industrial Course

Major Charles P. Cole, USA, of 125 Weymouth Rd. was recently cited by Lieutenant General August Schomburg, USA, commandant of the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, for having completed the College's correspondence course with honors.

Operating under the direction of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the Industrial College devotes itself to the study of the economic and industrial aspects of national security under all conditions and in the context of both national and world affairs. It also gives due consideration to the interrelated military, logistical, administrative, scientific, technological, political, and social factors affecting national security. Its correspondence course, entitled "The Economics of National Security," is based on the curriculum of the resident course conducted at Fort Lesley J. McNair for senior military officers and government officials.

The one-year correspondence course is open to qualified civilians in government, business, industry, and the several professions as well as to officers of all military components. Texts and instructional materials are provided at no cost to the student. Interested persons may address their applications to the Commandant, ICAF, Washington 25, D. C.

Tobacco Growers To Meet February 25 In Henderson

L. T. Weeks, general manager of Flue-Cured Tobacco Cooperative Stabilization Corporation, and the cooperative's director from District 8, T. W. Allen of Creedmoor, have announced that the 7th annual Stabilization District Meeting for tobacco growers in District 8 will be held in the Vance County Court House in Henderson on Thursday, February 25, beginning at 2 p.m. District 8 includes Moore and nine other counties.

Both Weeks and Allen emphasized that, although growers have voted overwhelmingly for the continuation of production control and price supports, certain basic problems must be resolved in order to maintain a sound program. Growers attending the Henderson meeting will have an opportunity to discuss the overall operations of the price support program as administered by Stabilization. Also, officials of Tobacco Associates, Inc. and Tobacco Growers' Information Committee will be on hand to discuss with growers current developments within their specific areas of work.

District No. 8 growers are represented on Stabilization's Board of Directors by a representative elected by growers for a 3-year term. The election of the director to serve on Stabilization's Board for the next three years will be held in the business session of the meeting.

Stabilization's members elect annually an Advisory Committee from each county in the district. These committeemen help to disseminate information regarding Stabilization's operations to other tobacco growers in their area, as well as to the general public.

MOORE COUNTY YOUTHS ELIGIBLE

Forestry Study Scholarships Offered

The Hopewell, Virginia, District of the Continental Woodlands Division, Continental Can Company, Inc., has announced its scholarship program for 1965. Two scholarships for \$1,000 per year for four years of study in the field of professional forestry will be awarded by the Hopewell Woodlands District this year. One scholarship will be awarded to a north Carolina student and one to a Virginia student.

This is the 12th consecutive year that the company has offered similar scholarships to outstanding graduating seniors in Virginia, North Carolina, Georgia, Florida and South Carolina.

To be eligible for this scholarship, an applicant must be a resident of Virginia or North Carolina, in a county in which Continental Can has land ownership or procures pulpwood, or who is a resident of a city which is geographically located within the same counties. Moore County meets these qualifications.

The award winner this year may attend the School of Forestry, North Carolina State at Raleigh, North Carolina or West Virginia University at Morgantown, West Virginia.

High School seniors who will graduate this spring and are interested in applying for this

scholarship, should contact their principals or guidance counselors for application forms and other details.

Applications should be completed and received by the Hopewell District office no later than March 15, 1965. The 1965 winners will be announced after April 6, 1965.

Daniel McGill of Lakeview, a student at Vass-Lakeview High School, was awarded one of the scholarships a few years ago and became a forestry student at N. C. State.

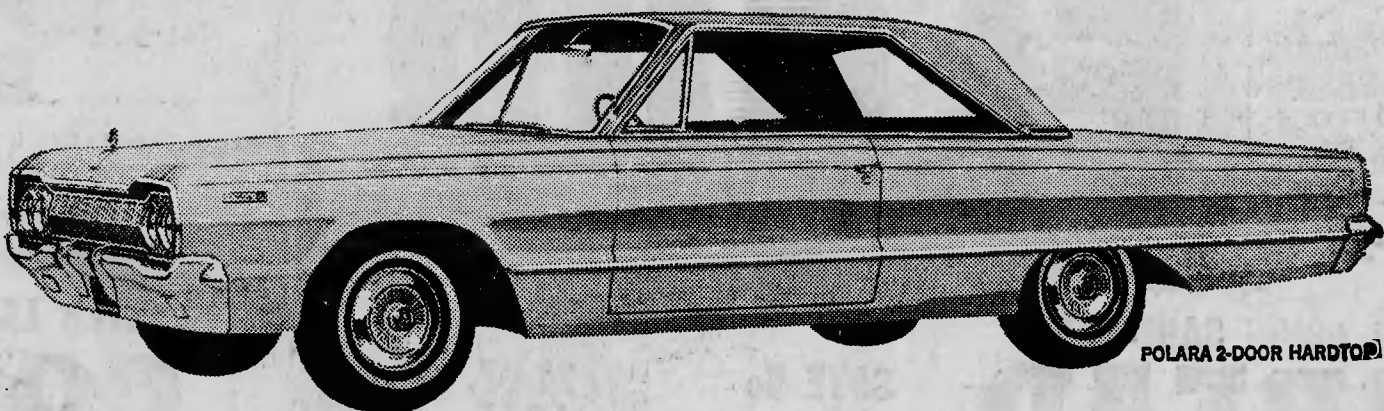
