Library Personnel From 3 Counties Attend One-Day Training Workshop

Library personnel from Richmond, Moore and Montgomery Counties attended a one-day training workshop Friday in Rockingham at the Library.
"Use of Film in the Public Library Program" was the topic for the day. Vincent Anderson, audiovisual consultant from the State Library, and Miss Hollis C. Haney, director of the Sandhill Regional Library, stressed during the morning session that a variety of subjects are available on film through the library. The N. C. State Public Library Adult Film Program (organized in 1962) houses 1,500 films on education, literature, art, business management, travel, gardening and other subjects.

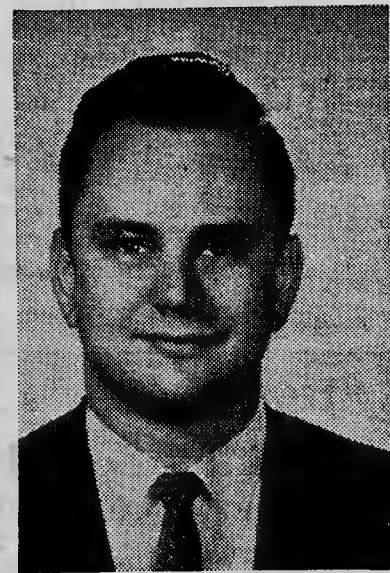
