**MOORE COUNTY RECORDER'S COURT**

**Assault, Liquor, Traffic Offenses Charged In Cases Heard At Carthage**

Following is a summary of cases heard in Moore County Recorder's Court at Carthage on Monday, with Judge J. Vance Rowe presiding:

Charles Stewart Cameron, careless and reckless driving, prayer for judgment continued on payment of \$25 and costs; Walter Stinnett, Carthage, assault on female, on request of prosecuting witness prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs; J. W. Tidwell, Aberdeen, trespass and malicious damage to property, prosecuting witness, defendant's father-in-law, stating that he and defendant have made up their differences, prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs; Curtis Pilson, Cameron, Route 1, failing to yield right of way, leaving scene of accident, prayer for judgment continued on payment of \$25 and costs, defendant to pay or cause to be paid damage to auto; Bishop Marion McRae, Jr., Carthage, Route 3, careless and reckless driving, \$25 and costs; Wesley Vest, Taylor-town (Pinehurst), assault on wife, threats, etc., striking her with pistol, 90 days, defendant not to be assigned to work till examined by prison physician, suspended for two years on payment of costs and on good behavior conditions, especially toward his wife, with defendant's wife to surrender the pistol to be destroyed by the sheriff.

Herbert Stanback, Southern Pines, unlawful possession of illicit whiskey; Nellie Stanback, Southern Pines, unlawful possession and transporting; George Robinson, Jr., Southern Pines, transporting illicit whiskey, failing to stop at stop sign, each defendant found guilty but court is satisfied the whiskey belonged to Hubert, not to Nellie or George Robinson; as to Hubert, 90 days suspended for 12 months on payment of \$50 and costs, prayer for judgment continued for the other

two for two years, on payment of costs, all not to violate prohibition laws, the six jars of whiskey to be destroyed.

Bruce Diggs, Stanfield, failure to comply, defendant to pay \$15 per week till delinquency is paid, then to resume regular \$10 weekly payments, the case continued under former order of the court; William Hoke Wood, Vass, driving while drunk, 60 days suspended on payment of \$100 and costs, license suspended, appeal noted, bond set at \$300; Richard June Walker, Vass, Route 1, speeding, racing, speeding 85, careless and reckless driving, motion for non-suit allowed on account of failure of State to identify defendant as driver of the car; Howard Carson Campbell, Cameron, Route 1, speeding 85 in 55 zone, found guilty of driving in excess of 70, \$40 and costs; William Hart, Eagle Springs, driving without license, and reckless driving, 60 days suspended for 12 months on payment of \$50 and costs, not to violate speed laws nor operate car till he first obtains proper license.

Joe L. Beachum, Raleigh, Route 2, speeding 70 in 55 zone, \$15 and costs; Jack Page Ellis, Raleigh, Route 8, careless and reckless driving, accident and personal injury (to defendant only), prayer for judgment continued on payment of \$25 and costs, defendant to pay or cause to be paid damage to telephone pole and auto which he struck; Alton Frank Goins, Carthage, driving while drunk, unlawful possession of seal-broken whiskey, 60 days or \$100 and costs, with license suspended; Josephine Gardner, Carthage, abandonment of three children, 10 days in jail suspended for 12 months on payment of costs and on good behavior conditions to look after her children to the best of her ability.
