Visit NASA Programs

Some students and faculty from the Science Department attended a lecture at Chapel Hill last Friday and a program at Morehead Planetarium last Saturday. The programs were sponsored by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

The Friday lecture was delivered by Dr. Cyril Ponnamparuma, Chairman of the Exobiology Division of NASA. His lecture, "Chemical Evolution and the Origin of Life," dealt with the possibility of life on other planets and the development of that life. A reception was held afterward at the Faculty Lounge of the Planetarium.

The Saturday program, "Footprints on the Moon," familiarized the audience with the flight of Apollo 11, now scheduled for a July launch in which the first lunar landing of man will occur.

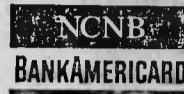
