**MR. JOYNER'S DECISION.**

The decision of Superintendent James Y. Joyner to remain at the head of the public schools of this State will be received with delight throughout every section. When the Board of Trustees of the State Normal and Industrial College met in Greensboro Tuesday, it was generally understood that Mr. Joyner would be chosen as President of the college to succeed the lamented McIver. Mr. Joyner stated to the Board that he could not accept the position and Prof. J. I. Foust was continued at the head of the school as acting president. The earnest appeals from all sections of the State to remain in his present position were too strong not to be heeded. Mr. Joyner, in his decision, has perhaps cast aside a cherished ambition, but his State will honor him for what he has done. His duty is to carry on the great work of building up and strengthening the public schools. Mr. Joyner is by far the best State Superintendent that has filled the office within our recollection. The State could ill afford to lose him at this time when so much is needed to make our schools what they should be.

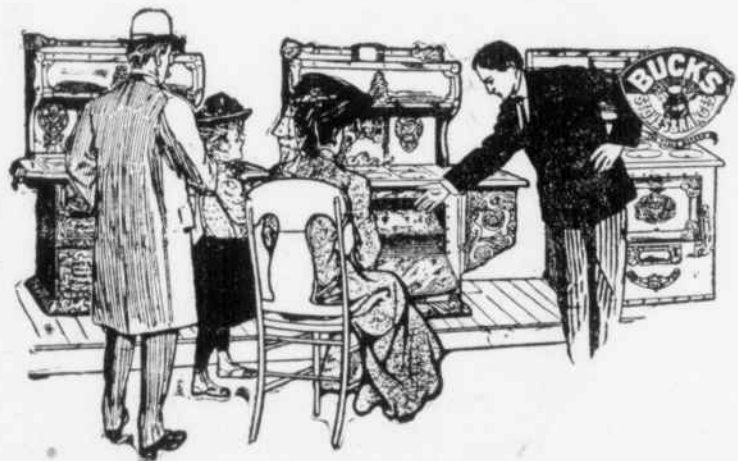
