Allies Are Agreed Upon a New Map.

Washington, Aug. 6.—The Allies have come to a full agreement as to the remodelling of Europe's map after the war. A sketch showing the peace aims of these countries was shown a United Press correspondent to-day at one of the allied embassies. Taking territory here, straightening lines there, they intend to have such restorations as will tend toward international peace in the future. While Germany dreams of a Mittel Europe, running from the North Sea to Bagdad under Teuton dominion, the Allies have agreed that the war shall go on until this dream vanishes. First in the Allies' proposals is the restoration of Belgium. France, according to plans, is to have Alsace-Lorraine. Constantinople will be internationalized, and the Turkish Government's grasp on Europe lessened. The Grecian boundary will be shoved northward, while Greece will also get some of the islands near her in the Mediterranean. Italy will have Trent and Trieste, some straightening of her northern boundary, and a small slice of territory across the Adriatic. Croatia and Bohemia will be made into independent States, while Poland will be established as an independent territory as a buffer between Germany and Russia. It is proposed to divide Austria-Hungary into two States. These readjustments are not based upon conquest, but upon determination that peoples shall live in States of their own nationality. The Allies do not propose to yield German African colonies, in view of Germany's abuses. These terms are allied terms. America has not lent itself to them. All this Government says on such subjects is, "Let us beat Germany and the lines will then take care of themselves."—Carl D. Groat, in New York Evening Sun.

BANKING SYSTEM MAKES GAINS

For the Year Ended June 30, Last, Records Broken in Institutions and Resources.

In making public the record for the fiscal year ending June 30, of increases and decreases in the number and capital of national banks, the comptroller of the currency says: "The fiscal year just closed has witnessed extraordinary progress in the growth and development of the national banking system. "Notwithstanding the large number of consolidations of national banks with other national banks, and making allowance for all liquidations for conversion into State banks, and failures (the latter being comparatively few), there will be in operation in the United States on June 30, 1917, 7635 national banks, a greater number than ever before, while in resources and deposits our national banks during the past year surpassed all previous records. "For the 12 months ending June 30, 163 new national banks were chartered with \$9,470,000 of capital against 177 new charters the previous year with \$7,505,000 capital. "During the 12 months 150 national banks increased their capital in the sum of \$25,507,490. The previous year the increases were 92 and the capital increase of existing banks was \$9,607,700. "In 12 months ending June 30, the total number of new national banks chartered plus the number increasing their capital was 313, against 209 the previous year, an increase of 104. The total increase in capital arising from banks newly chartered was \$34,977,490; the previous year \$17,112,700—more than 100 per cent. "In the year 19 banks reduced their capital in the sum of \$1,255,500. The previous year 21 reduced their capital \$1,047,500. "For the year 23 national banks, with \$6,225,000 capital, liquidated and consolidated with other national banks. Similar liquidations previous year, 45; capital, \$6,660,000. "Liquidations for purposes other than consolidation with other national banks, 1917, 87; capital, \$8,902,500; previous year, 87; capital, \$7,893,000. Receiverships year ending June 30, 1917, six; capital, \$1,180,000; previous year, 15, with capital, \$935,000.

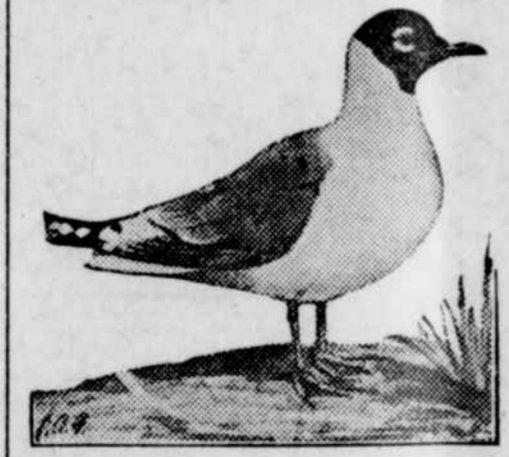
SENTENCED 35 MOLOKANAS UNDER THE DRAFT LAW

FRANKLIN'S GULL (Larus franklini)



Length, fifteen inches. During its residence in the United States Franklin's gull is practically confined to the interior and is the only inland gull with black head and red bill. Range: Breeds in the Dakotas, Iowa, Minnesota, and the neighboring parts of southern Canada; winters from the Gulf coast to South America. Habits and economic status: Nearly all of our gulls are coast-loving species and spend comparatively little of their time in fresh water, but Franklin's is a true inland gull. Extensive marshes bordering shallow lakes are its chosen breeding grounds, and as many such areas are being reclaimed for agricultural purposes it behooves the tillers of the soil to protect this valuable species. When undisturbed this gull becomes quite fearless and follows the plowman to gather the grubs and worms from the newly turned furrows. It lives almost exclusively upon insects, of which it consumes great quantities. Its hearty appetite is manifest from the contents of a few stomachs: A, 327 nymphs of dragonflies; B, 340 grasshoppers, 52 bugs, 3 beetles, 2 wasps, and 1 spider; C, 82 beetles, 87 bugs, 984 ants, 1 cricket, 1 grasshopper, and 2 spiders. About four-fifths of the total food is grasshoppers, a strong point in favor of this bird. Other injurious creatures eaten are billbugs, squash bugs, leafhoppers, click beetles (adults of wireworms), May beetles (adults of white grubs), and weevils. Franklin's gull is probably the most beneficial bird of its group.
