Now that parliament has consented to a franchise for the Behr monorailroad, to be worked by electricity between Manchester and Liverpool, the world will have an opportunity of seeing what can be done in fast speeds. There is a short overhead one rail road in Germany, which is operated with some success, but the English call for speeds raging from 100 to 150 miles an hour: This looks fast for the mother country. Yet it will not do to say that 150 miles an hour is impracticable. Reputable engineers testi fied before a committee of Parliament in of the scheme.
