Washington, July 22nd, 1901.

The Sampson-Schley controvercy is again raging like a house afire. The present revival was started by the publication of the third volume of Maclay's History of the U. S. Navy, which is used as a text book at the Naval Academy, in which Rear Admiral Schley is called "coward" and other insulting epithets. The author-a clark in the Brooklyn Navy Yardin saying that he had submitted proofs to Secretary Long, was under-stood to mean that Secretary Long had approved of the 'use of the abusive enithets.
