LIVE ITEMS OF INTEREST

Director Kerr and The Reformatory

GEN. COX IN RALEIGH

A Bill will be introduced in the North Carolina Legislature Providing for Compulsory Education

Raleigh, N. C. Dec. 17.

The plan of Director Kerr, of the State prison board, looking to the establishment of a reformatory for young criminals in this state ought to be successfully carried through. This plan is in brief to devote the net earnings of the penitentiary or as much as shall be needed, to the building and maintenance of the reformatory.

We are so far that some of Mr. Kerr's associates in the management of the penitentiary are opposed to his excellent idea, and we hope they can be induced to withdraw their opposition.

Since writing the above we find the following in the Charlotte Observer on the same subject:

"That appears to be an excellent idea. There is something repulsive about a State making money out of its criminals, and this use of funds accruing from their labor seems to be most appropriate. The fact that there is opposition to the plan on the part of members of the board is to be regretted, for the State certainly needs a place for its youthful criminals, and a direct appropriation by the Legislature for such a purpose is indeed doubtful."

North Carolina is behind her sister States in this particular matter, and it is not consistent that she should remain so; for we are in advance of many States in other important matters of public policy.

The objection that has been raised, when this reformatory matter was before the Legislature a few years ago to the effect that the inmates of such an institution would be chiefly composed of young negroes, ought not to be allowed to defeat the efforts now making in renewing the agitation of the subject.

I f course, the two races could, and should, be separated, and the General Assembly can easily find a way to accomplish that end.
