**Teachers Meeting.**

On the 18th of January the public school teachers of the county will meet to perfect a permanent organization for the whole county. The organization is required by the laws of North Carolina and all the public teachers are required to be members. Prof. Peel will be the organizer and he is doing all in his power to make it comply with the purpose of the law in every respect and create an enthusiasm not anticipated by the law. There will be an interesting program and it is hoped that the teachers will enter the spirit of the organization and show the proper enthusiasm.

Teachers will receive pay for that day and the names of those present will be taken by the county Superintendent.

**Farmers Meet, Peanut Growers Organize.**

There will be a meeting of the farmers of Martin County in the court house on Tuesday the 16th. The meeting will be for the purpose of discussing farm subjects, stock raising, and the cultivation and the marketing of crops. These subjects will be discussed by specialists in their line and will necessarily be of much benefit to those present. There will also be a number of talks by farmers of the county in connection with the discussions of the specialists, making it altogether a very profitable meeting.

In addition to the discussion of farm subjects there will be an effort made to organize the peanut growers of this section, not alone for the purpose of controlling acreage but for the purpose of marketing the crop so as to keep out of the hands of speculators. This organization will not only be for the purpose of controlling future crops but the crops now on hand. This is a phase that should interest every farmer and business man in the county and it is hoped that a large number will be present.

Every body who is interested in the progress of our section should attend. Peanuts are a great source of income to our county when the price is a fair one; our soil is naturally constituted for their profitable production and the growth and success of a crop is now practically sure. The only question is that of price.

The fixing of price heretofore has been in the hands of speculators it should cause everybody in Martin to be interested in this meeting.

Let everybody attend, it will be the best days work of the year.
