Enlarging Capacity

The Virginia-Carolina Peanut Co. is enlarging its plant, adding two more machines that will practically double its output. With the additional machines the company will turn out 500 bags of cleaned goods daily. This plant, employing about forty people, is quite an addition to Williamston's enterprises, paying out about \$275 weekly for labor.

The four banks of Martin County publish in this issue statements of their condition at the close of business Friday, February 14. It is very gratifying to know that the financial institutions of our county are in such good condition.

The combined capital, surplus and undivided profits of the four banks in Martin county is \$87,335.96. Eight years ago we had one private bank with a capital of \$3,000.
