**Pensions**

We have been asked to publish any and all changes in the law regarding pensions for Confederate soldiers. The Legislature made no additional appropriation, except to allow any soldier who lost both arms, or one blind in both eyes, or one having lost a leg and arm \$150 annually. An amendment to the laws of 1907, provides that widows who married Confederate soldiers prior to 1861 are entitled to receive pensions for widows. The allowing county commissioners to levy taxes as a mere makeshift as there is nothing compulsory about it. The old soldiers are rapidly answering the last call, and the Legislature of 1909 should have increased the pensions.

The act is as follows:

Section 1. That the boards of county commissioners of each county in the State of North Carolina be and they are hereby authorized and empowered for each and every year to levy a special tax at the same time and in the same manner with the levies of other county taxes, of not exceeding two cents on the hundred dollars valuation of property and six cents on each taxable poll, the constitutional equation between property and poll to be observed each year; if in their discretion such levy be deemed advisable.

Section 2. Such tax shall be collected and accounted for by the sheriff or other tax collectors in the same manner and under the same penalties as other taxes are levied for said county, and the net proceeds thereof shall be applied each and every year to increase pro rata the pension of such persons as stand upon the Confederate pension roll of the county for the year for which such tax is levied.

Section 3. The amount collected and disbursed under this act shall be reported by the county treasurer or other disbursing officers of the county to the State treasurer on or before the first day of June in each year, and the State treasurer's report shall show in a separate column the amount paid by each county annually under this act.

Section 4. That all laws and parts of laws in conflict with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This act shall be in force from and after its ratification.
