Of the the same is paid on or before that date, fancy there are, perhaps, a few who would devote their time and money to the line, if there was no such thing as profit to be derived from it. But there would not be enough of that class to hold to our standard and fancy breeds. Now the truth is, if it were not for the profit to be obtained, the poultry interest never could have reached the magnitude that it has attained at the present time It has been stated that there are greater profits made from poultry, considering the amount of money invested and labor expended, than from any other branch of business. This is no doubt true, and it is a fact that the returns are realized in a shorter time than from any other kind of live stock that the farmer keeps. Poultry is handled largely by people not engaged in farming, and for this class of men it is usually a good investment. It would seem that the farmer could raise poultry at a greater profit, because of the free range and the opportunity of economizing the waste that would otherwise occur. Very often it is true that the farmer pays less attention to his poultry than anything else on the farm, yet it seems to be profitable to him at that: how to be profitable to him at that; how much more profitable it might be if proper care was given. I do not mean to say that success is always easy in the poultry business, for there are often trials and tribulations as in other lines of business. But with the present development and progress in the poultry busiiness, I consider that most of the troubles need not be experienced by the careful poultry man or woman.
