This can be placed directly over them, and there will be no danger of them smothering, even though kept from twelve to twenty-four hours thus confined.

·There should, however, he at least six chicks hatched before placing them in the nest, as it requires that number to develop enough body heat to keep each other warm. Any place out of the way, that is dry and about 60 degrees, will do to set the box, and it should never be placed to near a stove or other sources of heat.

It is best, and far more profitable, to spend time bettering the conditions of healthy your favorable consideration and chicks than to try to doctor those support. that do not have it, in them to pull themselves through.
