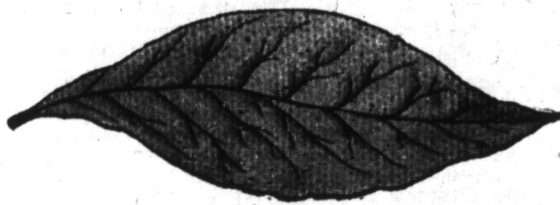

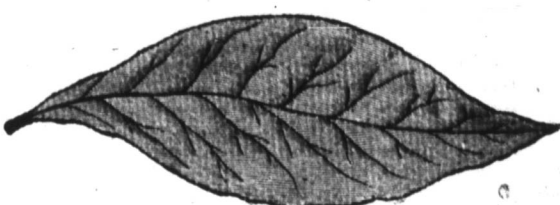

Whereas, It appears to my satisfaction, by duly authenticated record of the proceedings for the voluntary dissolution thereof deposited in my office, that the Robersonville Hosiery and Manufacturing Company, a corporation of this State, whose principal office is situated in the town of Robersonville, County of Martin, State of North Carolina (J. C. Robertson being the agent therein and in charge thereof, upon whom process may be served), has complied with the requirements of Chapter 21 of the Revisal of 1905, entitled "Corporations," and the amendments thereto, preliminary to the issuing of this Certificate that such consent has been filed:
