But after being cured and properly handled, it was placed on the warehouse floors for the inrealized more on three acres of good weed than they sold five-acre crops for before. Another year will soon be on us, and the preparation for the coming crop will begin. It will pay to put in a reasonable acreage in tobacco for the next year. Diversity your crop, Mr. Framer.
