## Notice of Primary Election

MARTIN COUNTY—NORTH CAROLINA

As required by An Act of the General Assembly of 1913, providing for Primary Elections in Martin County, notice is hereby given that a Primary of the Democratic Party will be held at the various polling places in said County, hereinafter named, on Thursday, the 6th, day of August, 1914. for the purpose of nominating candidates for the House of Representatives and all County and Township Officers.
