The State Board of Health is still receiving notices of anti-typhoid campaigns to be waged in counties of the State as the result of the efforts made some weeks ago, aided by Governor Beckett and the State Council of Defense. In some of the counties the campaigns against typhoid fever will continue through September, and the indications are that a larger number of people in the State will this year receive the benefit of the immunization afforded by the treatment than in any previous year.

The campaign against typhoid fever, the most preventable of all the preventable diseases, is receiving much encouragement from the results attained in the communities which have had anti-typhoid dispensaries in previous year. Especially is the army a shining example. With nearly three million men under arms either in France or in the United States typhoid fever has been unknown among them, because of compulsory anti-typhoid vaccination.

As a matter of fact the State Board of Health points out that typhoid vaccination is harmless, painless, causing no sore arms or ill after effects and not preventing any person from pursuing ordinary work. The treatment gives immunity from typhoid fever for a period of at least three years, and to it is accredited the fact that the disease has been banished from ranks of the United States Army, and from the armies of Europe. In a large number of counties in North Carolina special anti-typhoid vaccination campaigns are being conducted, and the State Board of Health is anxious that as many people as possible take advantage of the opportunity that is being offered.

And it pays, in dollars and cents. This was strikingly brought out at one of the dispensary points in Nash county some weeks ago where much enthusiasm was aroused by the remarks of Mr. W. S. Dozier, who after the crowd assembled, said that he hoped every one present who had not been treated recently would be, and added that years ago at his father's home typhoid attacked the family when they had one hundred and ten barrels of corn in the crib and a smoke-house full of bacon, that was when friends came and nursed and caught the fever. They had numerous friends and they came and were very kind, but when the day of settling up came, there was no corn in the crib, no bacon in the smoke-house, one member of the family was dead, with an eight hundred dollar doctor bill, and they never knew what the other bills amounted to.

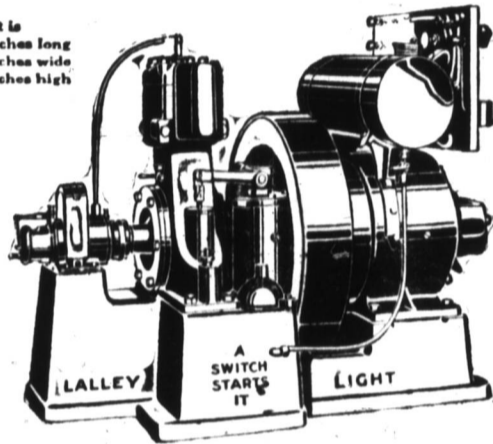
