Why Farmers Should Keep a Bank Account

Farmers, as a rule, keep no book of account. Their bank deposit book affords them a complete record of their cash receipts, while the stubs of the check book are a perfect record of expenses and payments. Paying a laborer, a store account, or any other bill with a bank check is much safer than with money; because the person receiving the check must indorse it, and the check being returned to the maker by the bank, can be presented as a receipt. Money deposited in a bank is not so easily and so often "folded away" as when carried around in one's pocket.
