

WANT TWO NEW BANK SYSTEMS

COMPOSITE BILL TO GIVE FARMERS READY CREDIT TO BE REPORTED IN HOUSE

WASHINGTON, Feb. 28. — The house banking committee was prepared to make a formal report on the composite farm credits bill, framed after a bitter fight over the legislation among republican leaders.

As completed by the committee, after lengthy day and night sessions, for several days, the bill embraces provisions of both the Capper and the Lenroot-Anderson measures in proposing establishment of two new banking systems devoted exclusively to furnishing financial aid to farmers and live stock growers.

In the following provisions of the Lenroot-Anderson bill the house measure would establish a government institution with twelve branches, known as "intermediate credit bank" to be separate departments of the 12 federal land banks and each to have a capital stock of \$5,000,000.
