NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION IN HAMILTON SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Board of Education of Martin County having presented a petition

asking that a special election be held in Hamilton School District for the purpose of issuing bonds in a sum not to exceed TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$20,000.00) to build and equip a modern school building in the said District, and it appearing to this Board that said petition is in accordance with the provisions of Article 22 of "An Act to amend the Consolidated Statutes and to codify the laws relating to Public Schools," Public Laws of North Carolina, General Assembly 1923, the following order of election was upon motion unanimously passed.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION IN HAMILTON SCHOOL DISTRICT

A special Election is hereby ordered to be held on Tuesday the 21st day of August 1923 in Hamilton, N. C. in Hamilton School District, Martin County, said District being bounded as follows:

Beginning at Whitehurst Bros. line on Roanoke River, on the North side; thence West up said Whitehurst Bros. line to the Hamilton-Palmyra public road, across said road to Whitehurst Bros. line; thence down Whitehurst Bros. line to F. L. Gladstone's line; thence down F. L. Gladstone's line to Anthony and Thomas line; thence West down Anthony and Thomas line to Cloman Farm line; thence West down the Cloman Farm line to Rocky Swamp; thence down said Rocky Swamp to Conoho Creek; thence South down said Conoho Creek to F. S. Purvis line on the south side of said creek; thence south down F. S. Purvis line to the Hamilton-Hasse public road; thence down said public road west to the road leading to Golf Point; thence South down said Hamilton-Gold Point public road to Pende Swamp; thence down said Pende Swamp to W. J. Meeks line; thence East down W. J. Meeks line to the public road; thence North down said public road to Bates Branch; thence up said Bates Branch East to the Wild Cat road at Taylor's Gin House; thence South-east down said Wild Cat road to the E. D. Roebuck line; thence North-east down said E. D. Roebuck line to F. J. Roebuck line on the Hamilton and Williamston public road; thence down said F. J. Roebuck line to the Spates Farm line; thence down the Spates Farm line and F. J. Roebuck line north-east to M. P. Taylor line; thence down said M. P. Taylor line to V. R. Taylor line; thence down

said V. R. Taylor line to Conoho Creek; thence down said Conoho Creek to J. P. Boyle line; thence down J. P. Boyle line to Deep Bottom; thence up Deep Bottom to Roanoke River; thence up Roanoke River to the beginning.

For the purpose of ascertaining whether a majority of the qualified voters of Hamilton School District are in favor of issuing Serial Bonds in a sum not to exceed TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS, bearing interest at a rate not greater than six per cent semi-annually to run for a period from three to thirty years, and that a special tax advalorem on all taxable property in said District be levied annually for the purpose of paying the interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds as they shall fall due, for the purpose of building and equipping a

modern school building in said Hamilton School District.

At said election, those in favor of such bond issue shall cast a ballot upon which is written or printed thereon the words "For the issuance of \$20,000.00 School Bonds, and the levying of a tax for the payment thereof", and those opposed shall cast a ballot upon which is written or printed the words "Against the issuance of \$20,000.00 School Bonds and the levying of a tax for the payment thereof", and if a majority of the qualified voters of said District shall vote in favor of the issuance of said bonds and the levy of said tax, then the Board of County Commissioners shall have the power to issue said bonds in accordance with said Act and levy annually a tax sufficient to pay the interest and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds as

they mature.

It is further ordered that a new registration of the voters be had for said Hamilton School District, and that J. L. Pritchard is hereby appointed Registrar and that D. G. Matthews and W. A. White are hereby appointed Judges of the said election, who shall hold the election as provided in said Act, and make returns of said election as is provided in said Act.

And it is further ordered that proper notices of registration and of election be published and posted as is provided in the said Act.
