**TWO AND ONE HALF YEARS TAKEN FROM THE SPAN OF LIFE**

**Cost of Tuberculosis in the State and Nation**

Something of the cost of tuberculosis both in time and money has been determined by Louis D. Dublin, statistician of the Metropolitan Life Insurance company. He has made an extensive study of facts and figures pertaining to the thousands of policy holders in the industrial department of the company, and gathered over a period of five years.

An interesting fact revealed by the study is that tuberculosis is cutting

short the life span of individuals two and a half years. In other words, tuberculosis were entirely eliminated and if other causes of death continued at the rate then prevailing, the result would be that two and one half years would be added to the life span of individuals.

That number of lost years, according to Mr. Dublin when translated into money value means a loss to the individual of two hundred and fifty dollars, or twenty six and one half billion dollars to the nation. To phrase it differently, the present generation would add that much more net wealth if tuberculosis were entirely eliminated.

But for each death from tuberculosis, adds the writer, there are probably five or six persons who are constantly ill from the disease. The ages of these were found to be between twenty and forty five years. For

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**Center Lining For roads Authorized by State Highway**

Adopting a plan which has been in many of the States in the east, having road building programs under way, the state highway commission calls attention to the new system of centerlining the roads when it is using.

From the center of every highway in the state, according to commission plans, a white and black line will be painted. The white will be used on the bituminous surfaced roads and the black on the concrete roads. The subject of this line is to divide the road exactly in half with the hope that traffic proceeding in opposite directions will keep to the right of the center.

This method has proven useful in other States in keeping automobilists to the right side of the road, the psychological effect, according to officials being great. The lines may be easily seen at night in the reflection
