GOVERNMENT AND BUSINESS

This country was founded 147 years ago in order that a government might be established free from outside political domination and the force of the law be supreme.

Our government was established to help and encourage, individual initiative and ambition. It is all a matter of a few of the cornerstones which formed the basis of our government. Let us reaffirm the desire to maintain open and unimpeded fields of individual initiative and activity which of recent years and during the war period, has been somewhat restricted.

TAX EXEMPTS DESTROYING THE INCOME TAX

It is a well known fact that the tax-exempt securities industry is the largest single source of tax evasion in the whole field of taxation. It is claimed that a progressive income tax and tax-exempt securities could not exist side by side, and the latter would destroy the former.

ELECTRIC POWER AGE

Using water power, coal and oil, to develop electricity is the industrial line of progress of this age. Twenty two billion kilowatt hours of electricity were consumed in the industrial plants of the United States in 1922, and more than sixty per cent of the energy used by three hundred thousand manufacturing plants was supplied through this great flow of power.

Of the three natural forces that have been harnessed by man, water power, steam power and electric power, the last and youngest has already caught and passed the others in point of service and bulk of work.

Salaries and wages paid to railroad employees of all classes for the first six months of 1923 averaged \$136 a month an increase of approximately \$4 a month over the corresponding period of 1922.

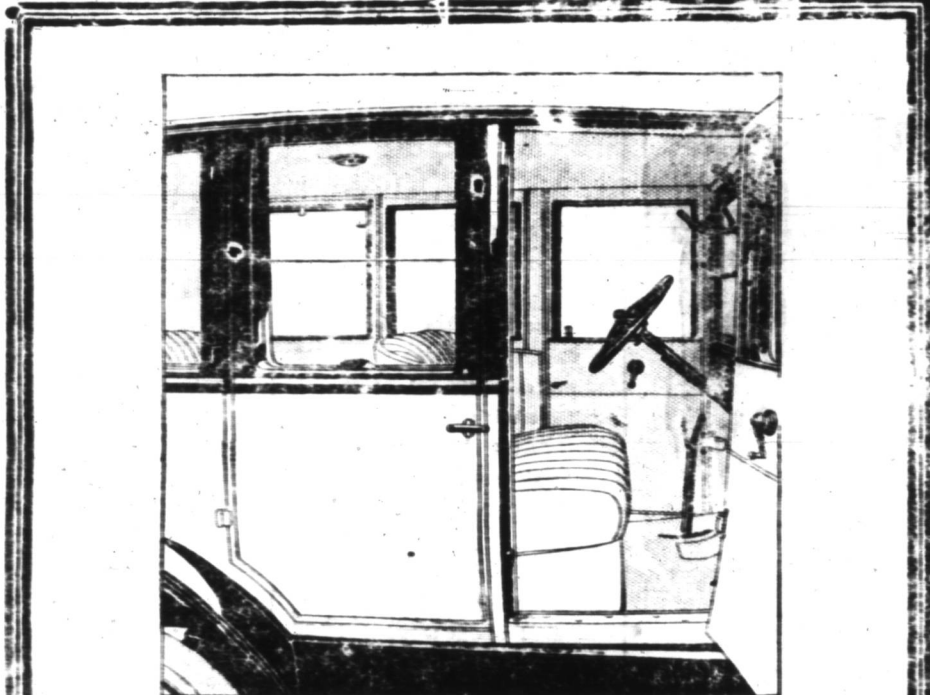
