

**BE SAFE THIS YEAR,
SAYS DIRECTOR KILGORE**

Raleigh, N. C. January 14.—The year 1923 was one of the most profitable years for farmers in North Carolina in a long time and it gives therefore, an opportunity to do three things which are now important because of the presence of the boll weevil, states Director B. W. Kilgore of the North Carolina Extension Service. Dr. Kilgore summarizes these things as follows:

1. Pay up all possible back debts.
2. Put aside enough money to buy fertilizers for cash. The difference between time and cash prices is too great not to do this.
3. Reserve enough cash to buy supplies, tools and equipment for producing crops during the coming season.

"These three things," says Dr. Kilgore, "will put the farmer largely on a cash basis, and if food and feed crops, meat, milk and butter are produced in sufficient quantity for the farm, the money crops, whether they be large or small, will be real money crops."

Dr. Kilgore has written a special letter to every farm and home demonstration agent asking them to bring this matter to the attention of their cooperating farmers and endeavor to get the thought into action. He says, "Because it is the wise thing to do and because the boll weevil is now present over all the cotton growing area, and will probably do severe damage this year, it is felt that the money received from the good crops of the past year should be made to count in the largest possible way as insurance for the future. This is a good time to get farming operations in North Carolina on a cash basis and the three things outlined should be done without fail."

There will be an egg laying contest in Cleveland County this year. Sixty-five poultrymen have entered their birds and about twenty more are expected to take part, reports county agent, R. L. Lawrence.

The early chicks make the laying pullets next fall. Use eggs for setting from birds of good performance.
