WHAT YOU SEE IN A DAY'S TRAVEL IN MARTIN COUNTY

The farmers of Martin county have never been in a more perfect state of perfection for the bearing of a crop than they are today. They are in the best shape they have ever been.

There is scarcely a spot to be seen anywhere that has not been well ploughed and pulverized with the proper modern implement, to get the desired effect. It is unfair to say the people are not working because they really are.

The most neglected part of the farm business would probably be attributed to the negligence in painting the dwelling houses and barns. Martin county may be and without doubt is inclined to be some what backward in this respect. The farmers don't seem to take into consideration that paint preserves, as well as beautifies.

Another pleasing phase of present day traveling is the good roads, and not a man complaining and cursing them. You will find eyes in Martin county quite a number of new Fords standing under the shelters, and the owners do not take even one news paper. It proves that we as yet, are not reading as we should and this forces us to draw the conclusion that we neglect our children and their welfare.
