

## PINEAPPLE CREAM FROM COWS

WELL, I see you have canned pineapple for breakfast," said a guest in a Honolulu home.

His hostess looked at him in astonishment, as there was no pineapple on the table.

"It's in this delicious cream," explained her guest, "The dairyman who supplies your cream feeds his cows on pineapple bran."

This is one of the by-products of canned pineapple. Practically all parts of the fruit are used for something in the Hawnitan Pineapple Company's cannery, and pineapple may appear on the table in any one of many forms. The thick, corrugated shell of the pineapple still holds juice and sugar after it has been cut of, and the pie fruit shaven o.c. These shells go to a department of the cannery where the juice is squeezed out and concentrated for canning syrup.

When mixed into a caze, pudding, ice cream, or cand, As many people like this fruit as an accessory rather than an integral part of a dish, however, the following recipe, suitable for a dessert for a special occasion, is given.

Gale Pineapple Dessert: Use a round tube part for something plain sponge cake matters. Ald one-half cup of sugar to one can of sleed Hawnitan pineapple. Boil for fifteen minufes; cool. Arrange cake on serving platter. Pierce with a fork and gently peur syrup ple slices around sale, overlapping the slices. See whipped cream on top and serve.
