



**PINEAPPLE CREAM FROM COWS**

"WELL, I see you have canned pineapple for breakfast," said a guest in a Honolulu home. His hostess looked at him in astonishment, as there was no pineapple on the table. "It's in this delicious cream," explained her guest. "The dairyman who supplies your cream feeds his cows on pineapple bran." This is one of the by-products of canned pineapple. Practically all parts of the fruit are used for something in the Hawaiian Pineapple Company's cannery, and pineapple may appear on the table in any one of many forms. The thick, corrugated shell of the pineapple still holds juice and sugar after it has been cut off, and the pie fruit slaves on it. These slices go to a department of the cannery where the juice is squeezed out and concentrated for canning syrup.

Not some sugar remains in the squeezed shells, for since Hawaiian pineapples contain twelve per cent of sugar, and also a percentage of starch. Sugar and starch make excellent food for cows, and for calves. The juice of the pineapple is also used for making "lemon" and "orange" and other fruit syrups. These syrups are used in Hawaii for the same purposes. However, most Americans prefer the "lemon" and "orange" syrups. These are delicate but distinct flavor

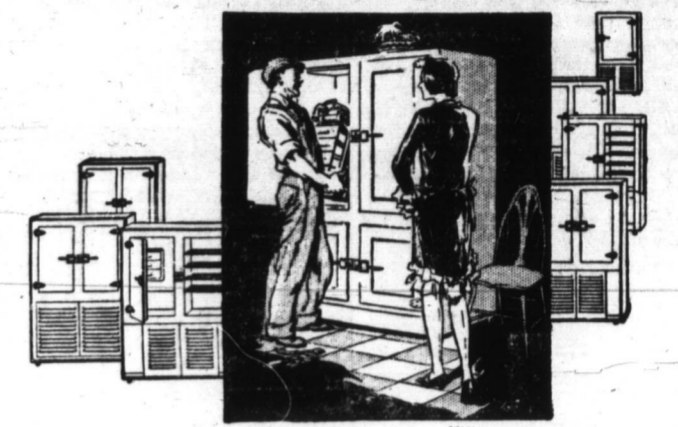
