

**HOLD FUNERAL HAMILTON BOY**

**Large Gathering Attends Final Rites of Carl J. Salsbury**

Hamilton, Feb. 18.—The funeral of Carl J. Salsbury, son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul L. Salsbury, was held yesterday at two o'clock in the Hamilton Baptist Church of which he was a loyal and consecrated member until death since the age of thirteen when he gave his heart and life to the Lord. The service was conducted by the pastor, E. P. West who was ably assisted by Rev. J. P. Gulley, of Crozet, Va. and Rev. J. K. Henderson, of Pembroke, N. C., two much beloved former pastors of the 19-year old youth.

The sad occasion brought together an honoring host of friends and loved ones. In addition to the immediate community, its environs and many from distant parts were there to pay tribute to the high esteem in which he was held even of the boys from Wake Forest College in which institution Carl was a student at the time of his going. The promising young man was popular among his fellow students, a member of the Euzelian Literary Society and had gained entrance into the Kappa Phi Kappa scholarship fraternity. To represent the literary society, educational fraternity and student body respectfully there were present C. L. Cope, Murphy, N. C., H. C. Hopkins, Elizabethon, Tenn., and J. M. Horton. The other four students present were Earl Bennett, Carl's roommate, T. G. Britt, Bernard Allsbrooks and D. V. Holliday.

Following the service at the church a deeply moved concourse of friends accompanied the remains to Scotland Neck where the body was interred in the Baptist cemetery. At the grave Dr. W. R. Cullom, of Wake Forest, delivered a brief and comforting message to a multitude of wounded hearts. There were also present from Wake Forest Dr. T. D. Kitcher and Prof. K. T. Raynor.

With the young men from Wake Forest, Clayton Davenport, "Gurthie" Ayers, Ray Bunting, Frank Haislip, Jr. and Herbert Everett, all of Hamilton acted as pall bearers.

The wonderful floral offering was altogether in harmony with the charming character and beautiful life of the one whose memory was being honored.—E. P. West, Pastor.
