

FOOD CROPS ARE MUCH INCREASED ALL OVER STATE

Reports Indicate Increase of Seven Percent In The Corn Crop

An expanded acreage in all major food and feed crops was planted last fall and will be continued this spring throughout North Carolina...

"Analyses of planting intentions gathered from hundreds of progressive farmers indicate that increases in food and feed crops will range from a 7 percent increase in corn acreage over last year to a 40 percent increase in barley acreage..."

a food and feed crop has been with barley, finds Mr. Sheffield. This crop is a good substitute for corn, yields well on poor soils and withstands winter freezes.

Mr. Sheffield also finds an increase of 13 percent in the spring farrowing of pigs. If enough corn is grown to feed these pigs into fat hogs, a good profit might be made from the combination, he thinks.

A rye cover crop planted by N. McClure of Clay county brought his livestock through the winter in good condition despite a shortage of other feeds caused by last summer's dry weather.
