# List Your Taxes

The annual period for listing taxes will begin on the 4th day of April, 1932. The date of listing was changed by the General Assembly of 1929 from the First Monday in May to the First Monday in April, Article I, Section 503. Each taxpayer is required to meet the township lister at the various places, which will be advertised in the respective townships, and give a true and actual return of all property owned by him, or held in trust for another, at its actual value in money. Each landowner is required to be prepared to report the acreage of each crop that is grown, the number of acres in each crop and such other information as may be required. Chapter 201, page 498, Public Laws of 1921.
