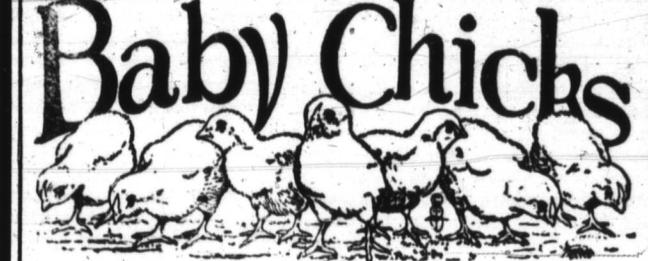

IMPORTANT

TAX LISTING BEGINS MONDAY, APRIL 4th

The Tax Laws provide that all real estate, new improvements, and personal property must be listed as of April 1st, 1932, and imposes a penalty of 10 per cent for "FAILURE TO LIST" during the month of April. The \$300 exemption covers only certain items of personal property, as shown on the form now available at the courthouse and other listing places.

FILE YOUR TAX RETURN EARLY

ALL MALE PERSONS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 21 AND 50 YEARS MUST FILE A RETURN ON POLL TAX.

Whether They Own, or Do Not Own, Real or Personal Property

Every person (male or female), firm or corporation MUST FILE A RETURN.

All personal property, such as stocks of goods, live stock, manufactured goods (or in the process of operation), machinery not affixed to realty, poultry, dogs, household and kitchen furniture, electric or ice refrigerators, wearing apparel, automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, flying machines, pianos, radio sets, diamonds, jewelry, bicycles, office furniture, typewriters, adding machines, cotton, tobacco, money on hand (not deposited in banks), billboards, sign boards, all property of minors, and all other property not specified hereon.

All bank deposits (checking or saving) in or out of State, certificates of deposits, itemized listed of all bonds (not including state or national), all annuity contracts, notes, deeds of trust, judgments, real estate bonds, book accounts, bills receivable, all claims and demands against anybody anywhere, with accrued interest.

All Administrators, Guardians, Executors, Executrixes must file tax returns on real or personal property in their custody.

File Your Tax Return During the Month of April and Avoid Penalty

All Real Estate Fire Claims must be reported, that have been precluded between April 1st, 1931, and March 31, 1932.
