The Barnett Brothers Circus will exhibit at the circus lot, near the Brick Warehouse, Williamston, on Monday, October 24th.

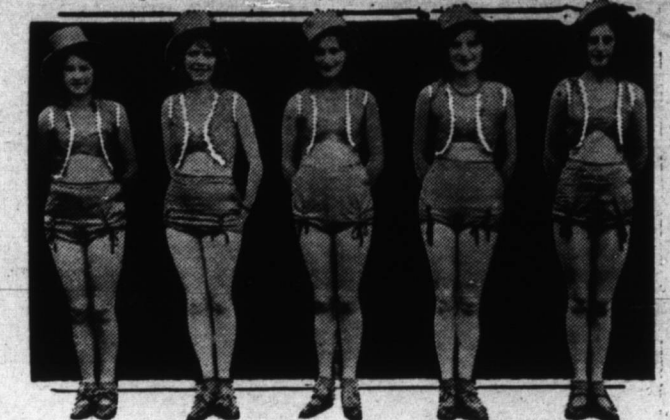
