

MRS. COCHRAN FILES SUITS FOR \$50,000 DAMAGES

Action Against Dr. L. C. McBrayer Started in the Courts This Week

Robersonville, November 10th.—Suits, totalling \$50,000 were instituted in the Martin County Superior court this week by Mrs. Lena Cochran against Dr. L. C. McBrayer, Southern Pines doctor, to recover damages resulting from an automobile accident in which the plaintiff's husband was fatally hurt and Mrs. Cochran and son, Leighton, were painfully injured.

Mrs. Cochran is asking \$30,000 damages as the result of her husband's death, \$10,000 for personal injuries sustained by her, and \$10,000 for injuries sustained by her son, it was learned filed by the plaintiff's attorneys, Smith and Horton, Tuesday of this week.

Mrs. Cochran, who suffered a broken leg and other painful injuries in the wreck, is getting along as well as could be expected, according to the latest reports coming from her bedside.

Mr. Cochran was fatally hurt and Mrs. Cochran and her son were hurt when the car in which they were riding was struck by another driven by Dr. McBrayer near here on Highway No. 90, Sunday afternoon, October 23rd.

The action started this week constitute the largest suits for damages filed in the Martin courts in years, it is
