### SAYS COMMON LESPEDEZA IS BEST FOR HAY

No Great Deal of Difference Shown in Tests Held in Eastern County

"All of the varieties used in the demonstration produced with in a few hundred pounds of each other, but the common was in the lead," says Enos State College, who had charge of the N. C. demonstration. "We planted the lespedeza in March on black land and LEAVE YOUR WATCH AND cut it on October 3. However, the hay was not weighed until October cured and dried. The weights show that the common variety produced 3,-900 pounds ofdr ied ay to the acre with the Tennessee 76 next with 3,580 pounds. Kobe was third with 3,490 pounds, and Korean fourth with 3,340

This demonstration again proves that the so-called improved varieties riety makes less of a show than the sates for this by the greater number of stalks on the ground, Blair says.

Mr. Blair has conducted a number

of field demonstrations with lespedeza all over eastern North Carolina this past season in an effort to popularize the crop among the crop farmers of that section and also to determine the most adaptable variety for hay, seed, and pasture. Some of these tests have been very valuable and indications are now that a considerable acreage will be planted on small grain
