plied to the home garden plot of course depends upon the size of the plot, but on soils of average fertility, about 10 two-horse wagon loads should be used to the acre. One load, therefore, would cover a space approximately 50 by 100 feet. Be sure that the manure is well rotted before applying. Where it is desirable to use a combination of manure and superphosphate for the garden soil the 10 loads of manure should be supplemented with from two to three bags of superphosphate Mount WEED; Danville
